claimed that he went on the payroll of Haskell Dairy at age 10 making a dollar a day in 1960. He got a bachelor's degree in business management from Presbyterian College and was commissioned a 2nd lieutenant in the U.S. Army Reserves (retired as a captain in 1981 – served from 1972-1981).

His longest career was with Recycle America/Waste Management company starting in Augusta, then Jacksonville, and later Birmingham – in most cases as plant manager – until 2002 when he returned home to Aiken County to land that has been in his family since 1922.

Sandy's other community roles include being president of the North Augusta Lions Club, president of the Belvedere Ridge Area Neighborhood Watch, and a member of the Aiken County Historical Commision (Banksia Mansion). The family has also hosted international students including two girls in the summer of 2009 – one from Hungary and one from Turkey.

Those who attended the Charleston HFA Reunion will remember Sandy and Joyce for the Haskell Invitational hats and the Haskell Dairy bottles complete with poems. The Dairy operated for sixty years from 1912 to 1972. The bottles are collector items as are the Haskell Dairy calendars from the 1930s and 1940s.
